

PROJECTS WE CONTRIBUTED TO IN 2014

- **\$8,000 annual donation to Seeds of Help Foundation Inc.:** Seeds of Help Foundation is a not-for-profit organization that provides grassroots-level assistance to improve the lives of people in Guatemala through: educational programs/opportunities for women and children, and construction projects for families, schools and communities.
- **\$4,00 annual donation to Grounds for Health:** Grounds for Health mission is an international non-profit organization, born out of and with enduring ties to the coffee industry and focused on increasing coverage of cervical cancer prevention services.
- **\$12,200 to CHES (Canadian Harambee Education Society):** All funds go towards sponsoring 100% of the education and room and board of 10 girls in Tanzania and Kenya
- **Silver Sponsor (\$6,000) to Mission Possible:** Mission Possible is a non-profit organization in Vancouver, British Columbia providing opportunities for people challenged by homelessness and poverty.
- **\$2,000 to El Chaupé Co-op, Peru:** The Co-op used all of the funds to build raised drying beds, which were greatly needed for El Chaupé's continued coffee production success.
- **\$2,000 to Adisque Co-op, Guatemala:** The Co-op used all of the funds to purchase copper sulphite, a successful combatant of leaf rust—a fungus that is currently devastating coffee farms in Guatemala.
- **Over+Above trip, Guatemala:** 12 JJ Bean staff will be building homes in Guatemala in Spring 2015 through Habitat for Humanity Canada (JJ Bean sales contributed: \$17,900 – customer donations: \$5,500)
- **\$500 to Vancouver Tweed Ride:** 2014 ride supported Power To Be Adventure Therapy Society
- **Bronze sponsor (\$200) to MEC Snowfest:** local film festival raising money for Protect Our Winters (POW), an organization that is raising awareness of the effects of climate change on our winters.
- **Travel mugs and free coffee to Hello, Neighbour (\$2,400 retail value):** Hello, Neighbour aims to offer useful housewarming gifts to the new residents at Alexander Street Community at 111 Princess Ave. This new residency will be run by the Portland Hotel Society, and will offer a home for the DTES' hard-to-house residents.
